Dear Friends,

The past few months seem to me to have been an especially fruitful time in terms of ministry here at St. John's. God has provided dozens of opportunities to lift our hands in praise for all God is doing in our midst.

Your witness to our congregation, our community and beyond to our neighbors and friends in Cuernavaca, Mexico has not gone unnoticed. You have shared in some of our small group settings how God has provided you with opportunities to support and pray with your siblings in Christ. You have served each other with humility and kindness. You have lifted up the names of those in need to the throne of Grace. You have been (and will continue to be) blessed to be a blessing to others.

A few weeks ago, I traveled with Larry Farmer, president of our Boyertown Rotary Club, his wife Joyce, and daughter Gwen, to Mexico to learn more about the projects that Wellspring Karitas engages. Larry and Joyce, having heard the story of our two prior trips through the voices of Ashley Gheer (age 17) and Tatum Friz (age 10), felt compelled to check out the rain capture/water filtration project in person. They are bright and intuitive leaders. They have eyes to see how clean water keeps children in school and how a quality education gets them out of their current circumstances, launching them into a future with greater opportunities to do unto others as they had done unto them.

Serving others with a clear purpose, enhanced by helping people we love in a tangible way, is at the heart of what it means to be a Christian. At a recent meeting of our Congregation Council, John Gheer, having been on two prior trips to join with Wellspring Karitas, passionately expressed how in those few days in Mexico he grew in understanding of what it means to follow Jesus and serve others. We have also heard his daughter Ashley speak of the impact of those trips and how they have helped her develop leadership skills she uses as she participates in the Youth and Government program hosted by the YMCA here in Boyertown.

Wellspring Karitas is clear about their purpose, they have a well-defined set of guiding principles that shape their behavior and frame their identity, and they are very selective about the projects they engage. They see what God is doing, the needs of the community, and they come alongside of those involved in those projects as partners, rather than take over the project with an attitude of 'we know better'. It's powerful to see renewable work. It is radically different than what many of us have grown accustomed to in what you know I've called, consumable work. The first energizes and the other drains the life out of even the best.

Why did I want to have our congregation experience Wellspring Karitas' work and how they work together? The answer is simple, it just isn't easy. Tod Bolsinger writes, "Leadership, then, isn't so much skillfully helping a group accomplish what they want to do – that's called management. Leadership is taking people where they need to go and yet resist going. It's challenging, encouraging, and equipping people to be transformed more and more into the kind of community that can accomplish the mission set before them."

The fifteen members from our congregation who have participated in our adventures with Wellspring Karitas in Mexico have been blessed to observe this way of organizing, to engage in renewable, life-giving work that is aligned with God's mission. I believe those of you who have heard their stories can attest to the increasingly apparent manifestations of how God has blessed them and in turn blessed us!

Take a look at your newsletter and see what your congregation has been blessed to engage. Come and join us in doing the things that God wants us to do.



Who will you invite?



To my fellow brothers and sisters at St. Johns,

I have decided to finally discern my call to ministry as an Authorized Lay Licensed Minister (LLM for short). I say finally because there was thought and conversation regarding this around 15 years ago, give or take a few years. Our Synod was holding Saturday classes, typically at Holy Spirit, Emmaus, which I decided to attend, so I could learn more about the Church and being a Lutheran. While going to these I was asked if I would be interested in pursuing being a SALM (Synodical Authorized Lay Minister). I was persuaded to visit St Paul's Lobachsville and to meet the SALM there at that time. After seeing what they did, I decided that the timing was not right for me, and thought "maybe when I am older", I could reconsider it. Approximately 15 years later, after hearing about the 6261 program, I decided to reconsider this call.

What is an LLM? From our Synod website: "Licensed lay ministers (LLMs) serve their congregation in a variety of ways. Some serve when their pastor or deacon is away. Some serve during a pastoral transition or long-term vacancy. Others serve as one of the 6 LLMs in a 6261 Ministry Community." (https://nepasynod.org/llm/). "Lay Ministers will be licensed by the Bishop to perform certain duties within specific congregations or 6261 Ministry Communities. These duties may include: Praying for their congregation or their 6261 Ministry Community (and its 6 congregations) along with the surrounding community and ministries; preaching; leading worship services; leading Bible studies; leading and coordinating small groups; visiting those in the hospital, the homebound, and others who request a visit; potential for licensed sacramental authorization in special circumstances."

This has come about due to a shortage of pastors to lead congregations. There are members (Lay Leaders) already supporting their church by preaching, visiting, and praying. The hope is that the LLM program will give structure with "Good Lutheran Theology", but not to deter what good works are already being done. It's better to think of it as coming alongside congregations, pastors and lay leaders to continue to perform the ministry of the Church.

The weekend of October 12 I was on a retreat with around 20 LLM candidates. The title of the retreat was <u>Confessions Retreat</u>. Topics included:

- The Basics of Lutheran Preaching (Funeral Preaching), led by Pastor Albers.
- The Basics: Justification by Grace through Faith on account of Christ
- The Basics: Law and Gospel/Theology of the Cross
- Applying the Basics to Congregational Life: Word and Sacrament
- Applying the Basics to Life in this World: Vocation & Two Kingdoms

Lutheran Confessions was taught by Dr. Timothy Wengert using <u>The Book of Concord</u>, which Dr. Wengert co-translated from the original German and Latin into English. There are 3 more retreats that are required, including: Lutheran Preaching; Lutheran Worship; and Pastoral Care. In addition to this there are 4 classes that are required: Hebrew Bible (Old Testament); Christian Scriptures (New Testament); Theology and Beliefs; and Church History to be taken at a local Seminary (in person or online).

What I need is your continued support and prayers over the next few years. Please feel free to ask me how it is going and any questions you may have.

WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY ABOUT TRUTH?

"You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." John 8:32

As I contemplate the coming of November, I have been thinking about truth, especially in regard to the onslaught of political advertisements. The following are excerpts from The New Bible Dictionary (1974) page 1301. I hope this will give you pause to reflect on what you read and see.

"Truth is used in the Old Testament in two senses: (1) the intellectual, facts that may be ascertained to be true or false and (2) the essential and moral, of truth as an attribute of a person.

Truth as a fact is reflected in the queen of Sheba's response to king Solomon: 'Then she said to the king, "It was a true report that I heard in my own land about your words and your wisdom. Nevertheless, I did not believe the reports until I came and my eyes had seen it. Behold, the half was not told me. You exceed in wisdom and prosperity the report which I heard."

The Old Testament thinks much more of the basis of truth in a reliable person than that of the mere facts. This reliability is an attribute of God: Psalm31:5 'Into your hand I commit my spirit; You have ransomed me, O Lord, God of truth.', Psalm 108:4 'For your lovingkindness is great above the heavens; and your truth reaches to the skies.' and Psalm 146:5-6 'How blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is the Lord his God; who made heaven and earth, the sea and all that is in them; who keeps truth forever.' Furthermore, when Joseph's brothers were detained in prison while one of the brothers is sent for Benjamin, '...that your words may be tested, whether there is truth in you...' (Genesis 42: 16b)

The God of the Bible is true, i.e. consistent in his loving care for his children and in his implacable hostility against sin. God sends truth forth (Psalm 57:3) and his word is true in the sense that it is permanently valid. Psalm 119:89 and Exodus Rabbah on 29.1... "As you are truth, so is your word truth, for it is written "Your word, O God, stands fast in heaven." Truth is demanded of man as his response to God in obedience to the law. Psalm 119:151 'You are near, O Lord, and all your commandments are truth. and in his inmost nature, Psalm51:6 'You do desire truth in the innermost being...' and is the bedrock of all human relationships, Exodus 20:16 'You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.'

In the New Testament, the word truth has more than one meaning. One meaning is dependability, truthfulness, and uprightness of character. This meaning applies to God and to man. Romans 15:8 'For I say that Christ has become a servant to the circumcision on behalf of the truth of God to confirm the promises given to the fathers...' Ephesians 5:9 '...for the fruit of the light consists in all goodness and righteousness and truth...' The idea of a God who can be trusted to keep his word is implicit throughout the New Testament.

Another meaning of truth in the New Testament is in the absolute sense of that which is real and complete as opposed to what is false and wanting. Ephesians 4:25 'Therefore, laying aside falsehoods, speak truth each one of you with your neighbor, for we are members of one another.' The Christian faith is the truth. Ephesians 1:13 'In Him, you also, after listening to the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation...' Jesus claimed that he was truth personified. John 14:6 'Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth and the life; no one comes to the Father but through me". Ephesians 4:21'...if indeed you have heard him and have been taught in him, just as truth is in Jesus...' He mediates the truth. John 1:17 'For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth were realized through Jesus Christ.' The Holy Spirit leads people into truth. John 16:13 'Jesus said, "But when the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own initiative, but whatever he hears, he will speak and disclose to you what is to come." By the Spirit's leading Jesus' disciples into the truth, they will know it, do it, abide in it, and their birth as God's children rests upon it. John 8: 32 'You shall know the truth, and the truth will set you free'. John 3:21 'But he who practices the truth comes to the light, that his deeds may be manifested as having been wrought in God'. James 1:18 'In the exercise of his will he brought us forth by the word of truth, so that we might be as it were the first fruits among his creatures.' The truth is God's active word that must be obeyed. Jesus declares that he is the true bread and the true vine, i.e. he is the eternal reality symbolized by the bread and wine."

I hope these words will give you pause to think about what the media says, to test the facts and premises, to find the Spirit leading to the truth.
