



## THE ACE THERE IS NO WAY TO GOD (PERIOD)

*Excerpts from Lutheran Trump Cards – Playing our best hand in the 21<sup>st</sup> century by Dave Daubert*

“One of Luther’s personal struggles was an obsession with getting life right so he could end up with God rather than be condemned. He tried to find peace in repenting and confessing but, as soon as he was done, he started to notice or remember things he had done but forgotten to confess. This literally drove him crazy and he could not find peace, no matter how he tried. Luther’s great insight discovered this key truth – nothing we can do can get us right with God and no amount of effort on our part can get us to eternity. In this matter, we are powerless.”

“On the surface this may not seem like a very good first card. You may be thinking, ‘Our best point is that there is no way to God? That sounds pretty negative and discouraging. We know so many people who are searching for God and trying to find their way. Can we really tell them to give it up, that there is simply no way to God at all – no exceptions?’”

“The Lutheran answer is to say, “Yes!” Tell them to give it up. The burden of trying to find a way to get to God and finding a system or activity or status that makes it possible, is life draining. It causes many people to lament their inability to get there or make any progress in their spiritual journey. Nothing sucks the life out of someone more than the endless attempt to arrive at the impossible.”

“The kindest thing we can do is help people see that they don’t need to get to God. The Christian message is grounded in a gospel where God always goes first, always initiates, and comes to us. Right from the beginning, when God made the world and everything in it, and then came to walk with Adam and Eve in the garden that God had planted for them to till and cultivate. It happened when God came to Abraham and Sarah, in the persons of three visitors and announced that they would have a son. It happened when Moses met God, who came to him and the burning bush and called him to lead God’s people to freedom. It happened over and over again in God’s story. It has always been this way. It continues to be this way. We don’t have any way to get to God. And, once we discover that, rather than working to figure out what will get us “there,” we are freed to simply be “here” and watch for God’s coming.”



Advent is the time of the year when we are invited to remember our foundational belief that God comes to us in Jesus. Remembering that God is active and alive and always on the move, we have to keep alert to the new thing God is doing. We can be the encouragement others need by helping them see the Old Testament has been fulfilled in Jesus. We can proclaim the truth that they are set free from the bondage and tyranny of working their way to heaven. We now live in an age radically different because of the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Freedom comes when we believe this truth and embrace the assurance of our salvation accepting the cards God has dealt us, “cards” that remind us of the victorious life we have been called to experience and share with others.

# LIVING LUTHERAN LIVES RETREAT
